

Collaboration by Fu Hong Society X Tai On Coffee and Tea Shop
扶康會 X 大安茶冰廳 聯乘活動

共融藝術與咖啡品嚐 Inclusive Art and Coffee Tasting



為建構價值共創平台，扶康會與懷舊冰室—大安茶冰廳合作，推出聯乘活動，期望將展能藝術家的作品融入商業環境，進一步發展共融理念。

作為香港的老字號茶餐廳，大安茶冰廳主打懷舊裝潢，帶出昔日香港的味道。是次聯乘活動包含三大重點：由本會展能藝術家 Nobody 以懷舊香港為主題的畫展、搭配本會服務單位產品的限定特別餐牌，以及本會實習咖啡師親自沖煮的咖啡工作坊。

扶康會展能藝術家 Nobody 特別為是次展覽創作更多滿載香港情懷的水彩畫作，每幅畫背後都有自己的故事及屬於他的童年回憶。食客可一邊享受美食，一邊欣賞畫展，了解一下精神復原人士的才能及內心世界。

於畫展期間，大安茶冰廳與扶康會推出限定特別餐牌。以經典茶餐廳飲品—杏霜鮮奶咖啡，搭配本會毅誠工場康姨餅房出品的康姨曲奇，而盛載著餐點的陶瓷製杯碟均由扶康會賽馬會石圍角工場的服務使用者親手製作，為這個特別餐牌加添意義。

有賴大安茶冰廳的配合，本會於 5 月 2 日舉辦的咖啡工作坊亦完滿結束。咖啡由扶康會賽馬會石圍角工場的實習咖啡師親自沖煮，更有導師在場講解。當日活動在展能藝術家 Nobody 的畫作映襯下，細嘗服務使用者沖調的咖啡，讓各參加者帶來一場體驗非凡的咖啡旅程。

本會感謝大安茶冰廳的支持，為是次聯乘活動建構一個價值共創平台，同時讓殘疾人士的卓越才華被社會大眾看見。

To establish a platform for value-cocreation, Fu Hong Society has collaborated with Tai On Coffee and Tea Shop (Tai On), a long-standing cha chaan teng in Hong Kong, to bring the artwork of artists with disabilities into commercial spaces and further promote social inclusion.

Tai On is celebrated for its retro decorations, evoking the flavours and atmosphere of old Hong Kong. This collaboration features three highlights: an exhibition of paintings themed around old Hong Kong by Nobody, one of our artists with disabilities; a limited-edition menu featuring products from our service units; and a coffee workshop led by our trainee baristas.

Nobody, the featured artist, has specially created a series of watercolour paintings inspired by old Hong Kong, each piece telling stories and childhood memories from his own life. Participants can savour delicious food while appreciating the artwork, gaining insight into the talents and inner worlds of person in mental recovery.

During the exhibition, a special limited-edition menu was introduced. Classic cha chaan teng drinks - Hong Kong-style almond latte are paired with Madam Hong cookie produced by Madam Hong's Bakery of Ngai Shing Workshop. The antique ceramic cups and saucers used to serve the set have been handmade by service users from our Fu Hong Society Jockey Club Shek Wai Kok Workshop, adding extra meaning to this unique menu.

Thanks to the support of Tai On Coffee and Tea Shop, the coffee workshop held on 2 May was a great success. Coffee was freshly brewed by trainee baristas from our Fu Hong Society Jockey Club Shek Wai Kok Workshop, with guidance from an instructor. Amidst the backdrop of Nobody's nostalgic paintings, participants enjoyed a memorable coffee experience crafted by our service users.

We are grateful to Tai On Coffee and Tea Shop for their support in co-creating this platform, enabling the exceptional talents of people with disabilities to be seen, heard and appreciated by the wider community.
